#### 4.1 CENTENARY OF THE YASS SOLDIER'S MEMORIAL HALL

#### REPORT

2023 marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Yass Soldier's Memorial Hall. Options for celebrations to be discussed as to what the Committee may recommend as a community event to mark the celebration of this occasion.

Governor General Lord Forster laid the foundation stone in **1922** and the building was officially opened by Brigadier General H E 'Pompey' Elliott on 5<sup>th</sup> March 1923. Designed by Vernon and Hill of Sydney as a war memorial and public hall; it was built by Walter Macintosh of Yass and paid for by public subscription.

The Yass Soldiers Memorial Hall Advisory Committee may wish to consider options that would allow the hall to be open and available to the public for such an event. As a suggestion any planned event could consist of a display of Yass Memorabilia and Hall history through the years. Keeping in mind the purpose being Yass Soldiers Memorial Hall, and the attraction of Youth to be involved in any such event.

The committee may wish to offer their thoughts and options for discussion at the meeting.

It is believed that Yass SPIN Foundation are in the process of organising a SPIN Foundation fundraiser event marking the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Hall in May 2023. The proposed event will be a Gala Ball consisting of 100 people at \$100 per ticket.

At this stage no other details have been discussed or a booking made with Council.

#### 4.2 COMPLETION REPORT FOR RESTORATION WORKS

#### **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

Funding was included in the 2022/23 Operational Plan.

#### **POLICY & LEGISLATION**

Local Government Act 1993.

#### **REPORT**

Council was successful in receiving funding through the Department of Veteran's Affairs 'Saluting Their Service', and NSW Office for Veteran's Affairs 'Community War Memorials' grants, to assist with the restoration of the Shrine area in the Memorial Hall. The \$18,300 in grants, along with \$7,480 in funds and labour from Council, enabled the following works to be completed in November 2022:

- Professional cleaning of the tessellated floor
- Repairs to the half barrel vaulted ceiling
- Painting of the ceiling & walls
- Restoration of the aluminium honour boards
- Restoration of the marble honour boards
- Upgrading the LED lighting

Before and after photos of the foyer show the beautiful transformation of this important space.







## 4.3 REPLACEMENT OF ROOF SHEETING AND ROOF MODIFICATIONS - YASS SOLDIERS MEMORIAL MALL

#### **SUMMARY**

Providing a report to the committee on the awarding of re-sheeting and roof modification works as per tender number YVC.IA.2022.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That that the information be noted.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Council determined to allocate \$714,454 from the Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program grant to the Yass Soldier's Memorial Hall roof replacement. \$50,000 has been allocated in the 2022/2023 Capital Works budget for maintenance on the Memorial Hall.

#### **REPORT**

#### 1. Background

A building dilapidation report was undertaken on the Yass Soldier's Memorial Hall by Peak Consulting and the findings of this report were presented to the Yass Soldier's Memorial Hall Committee on 7 October 2021

At its June 2022 meeting, Council resolved to allocate \$714,454 for replacement of roof sheeting as a priority.

Tenders were called on 2 November 2022 and closed on 30 November 2022. One tender was received.

At Councils meeting of 14 December 2022, Council resolved the following:

- 1. The tender submitted by National Roof Care Pty Ltd to undertake the Yass Soldiers Memorial Hall Roof Modifications and Re-sheeting be rejected for a total cost of \$1,113668.60 due to insufficient funding
- 2. The CEO and his nominated officer be authorised to negotiate with the Tenderer on progressing the completion of the following sections and to execute a contract to complete:

3. The \$19,388.50 additional required be funded from the 2022/23 Memorial Hall maintenance expenditure budget.

#### 2. Further negotiations with Tenderer

A meeting was arranged with the tenderer National Roof Care Pty Ltd to progress the completion to Roof sections 1-4 and 5-8 pending a further structural engineer's report on how to fix the crack in the southern side brick wall. This report is not to impede on the front roof replacement but to make sure that an engineer signs off on required brick work prior to roof replacement.

A report is currently being prepared to address making the brick wall structurally sound prior to replacing the roof over that section. There will be minor costing adjustment for this work. Pending the final cost, one of the smaller roof sections may be required to move to Stage II placement work in the future.

#### 3. Timeframe for work

National Roof Care Pty Ltd met with Council Manager Facility & Waste Assets – and Project Officer Facility & Waste Assets - to establish a start date and timeframe for completion.

National Roof Care Pty Ltd have an opportunity to start work on this project on the 20 February 2023. An anticipated completion date is mid May 2023.

Grant funding must be expended before 30 June 2023 under the terms of the funding agreement.

#### 4. Work to be Carried Out

#### **Building Background:**

A substantial two storey brick building with four stone pillars and stone facings, located in the main street of Yass. In the foyer are multiple honour rolls and plaques for conflicts in which Australia has been involved. The foundation stone was laid on 24 May 1922 and the dedication took place on 5 March 1923. Designed by Vernon and Hill of Sydney as a war memorial and public hall; it was built by Walter Macintosh of Yass and paid for by public subscription. It has housed a cinema, ex-serviceman's (sic) club, literary institute, and lecture room. Two upper storey rooms were added in 1928 and 1930.

#### **Project Background**

In April of 2021 Peak Consulting were engaged to carry out a dilapidation report with the purpose of getting an accurate understanding of the condition and materials of Memorial Hall and priorities repair work. As identified in the Peak Consulting report, the roof, flashing, box gutters and parapets are priority number 1.

All work to be carried out in agreement with Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program - Phase 3.

#### **Scope of works**

### 1.1 Engineering/redesign for modifications required to roof pitch to accommodate deeper box gutters.

#### Roof 1.

This roof and guttering will need to be reengineered and replaced to cope with the capacity of rainwater over the prescribed catchment area and box guttering will need to be redesigned to achieve adequate depth and fall.

Replacement of all roof sheets, battens, and flashings.

Patching a parapet wall cracks

**Replace Downpipes** 

#### Roof 2

Roof frame has a broken bearer that will need replacing

This roof and guttering to be replaced to cope with the capacity of rainwater over the prescribed catchment area and box guttering will need to be redesigned to achieve adequate depth and fall

Replacement of all roof sheets, battens, and flashings.

Patching a parapet wall cracks

**Replace Downpipes** 

#### Roof 3

This roof and guttering will need to be reengineered and replaced to cope with the capacity of rainwater over the prescribed catchment area and box guttering will need to be redesigned to achieve adequate depth and fall.

Replacement of all roof sheets, battens, and flashings.

Patching a parapet wall cracks

#### Roof 4

Requires new roof sheeting, battens, flashings, valley, guttering and facia. Replace Downpipes

#### 1.9 Agreed hand back condition

It will be the contractor responsibility for the site to be handed back in usable condition including work and storage zones, with all debris and waste materials removed from site.

This will be in liaison with the contract manager.



#### Scope of works (Contractor)

- 2.1 Site set up. (Load zones, material storage, scaffold etc)
- 2.2 Site security
  While under construction site security will be the responsibility of the contractor from handover until sign off.
- 2.3 Costing and timeframe per zone
- 2.4 Include all traffic and pedestrian controls.
- 2.5 Site establishment costs, waste disposal skip bins, Scaffolding

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Responsibility of contractor and expense included in tender price.

- 2.6 Removal and disposal of all current roofing.
  - Responsibility of contractor
- 2.7 Repainting of any required item, relation to work carried out.
  - Facia
  - Guttering
  - Flashing
  - Walls
  - Windows.
- 2.8 Expectations for repairs of Parapets

Supply and install of flashing, repair of capping and masonry cracking.

Any repairs to parapets are to be carried out in line with the Peak Consultants Report

#### **SUMMARY**

To present an update on the maintenance priorities for the Yass Soldier's Memorial Hall.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That the update report on the Memorial Hall maintenance work be noted.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS**

The following amounts have been included in the 2022/23 Operational Plan:

- \$50,000 in Operational Plan for maintenance
  - Part funds have been spent on upgrading the two front rooms ready for occupation.
  - Approximately \$20,000 has been approved by Council to support shortfall on roof re-sheeting.
- \$714,454 grant for roof replacement allocated from grant funding
- \$8,300 grant for restoration of Honour Rolls
- \$7,480 grant for foyer maintenance.

#### **REPORT**

#### 1. Introduction

There are three focus areas for maintenance of the hall:

- General Maintenance
- Roof Replacement
- Grants

#### 2. General Maintenance

The following amounts are proposed to be included in the 2023/24 Operational Plan for Council budget approval in June 2023:

- \$10,000 grant for front door maintenance (if application successful)
- \$50,000 General maintenance budget

The Committee may wish to consider priorities for 2023/2024 financial year as part of the function of this Committee for Council consideration.

#### 3. **Roof Replacement**

Council determined to allocate \$714,454 from the Local Roads & Community Infrastructure Program grant to the roof replacement.

Please see separate report for an update on the roof replacement.

#### 4. **Grants**

Two grants were received from the 'Saluting Their Service Commemorations Program' and the 'Community War Memorials Fund' for restoration of the Honour Rolls and Foyer.

Work completed includes:

- Upgraded LED lighting to foyer/shrine area
- Repairs to ceiling and painting of foyer ceiling and walls
- Cleaning to the tessellated floor tiles
- Restoration of the marble, bronze and aluminium Honour Rolls

A further grant application under the Community War Memorials Fund is expected to be submitted in February 2023 to restore the 3 sets of double doors at the front of the building.
