5.1 REQUEST FOR CAR PARKING SPACE FOR DISABLED PERSONS JONES PARK MURRUMBATEMAN

REPORT

Council has received correspondence from a road user raising concerns about the lack of parking for people with disability at Jones Park Murrumbateman. Refer redacted email.

It is noted that Council has commenced discussion with TfNSW South West in relation to a number of safety improvements in Murrumbateman village adjacent to the Barton Highway that are proposed to be undertaken over the next 12 months. These works will include:

- Footpath upgrade – western side of Barton Highway from Hercules Street to connect to the footpath adjacent to the Library (old School building) ;
- Intersection upgrade – entrance of Murrumbateman recreation area off Barton Highway
- Pedestrian fencing on eastern side Barton Highway
- Converting Jones Park carpark to single entry in (Yass side) and single exit out (Canberra side)
- Installation of a designated disable car parking space in Jones Park carpark

TfNSW South West are currently preparing the required plans for consultation, which will be presented to the committee once received

It is noted that the proposed works will address the part of the issues raised.

Following up on from contact from [REDACTED].

A Wodonga resident, a member of the Access committee in Wodonga.

They travel to Batemans Bay on a fairly regular basis and he is disabled and uses a wheel chair.

They have a scheduled stop at this park every trip. They regularly use the bathroom across at the Rec grounds. Currently there is no designated disabled car park in this area.

His suggestion is illustrated in the following PDF Image. Also to Add to the current signage to include notice of a disabled toilet, with others at the Rec grounds.

Alternatively, signage could indicate the disable toilet with parking at the Rec Ground.

The gate off the Barton seems to open. Peter Harvey has confirmed that access to the Rec ground is 24/7 and would be suitable for people with disabilities to park and use the facilities.

Either option would achieve the desired option of providing parking for disabled access to toilet facilities. However the drawn image would provide a flexible option for those wanting to access businesses across the Barton Highway.
