COMMITTEE DECISION


That Council allow the Youth Council to use the logo selected at this meeting.

REPORT


The Youth Council members represent all the youth of the Yass Valley when they are in public.

3.2 YOUTH MUSIC FESTIVAL - FEBRUARY 2023

SUMMARY

The NSW Government is providing funding through the *Creating Opportunities for Young People in NSW* Program. This report outlines an option for the Youth Council to hold a "Yass Valley Rising Star" event in February 2023 as part of this grant program.

COMMITTEE DECISION

That Council assist the Youth Council to develop and hold a Youth Music Festival in February 2023.

REPORT

At the first Youth Council meeting in June, the youth identified a need for more music events, especially for local talent. This has been used by Council staff to help identify a project that meets the requirements for Creating Opportunities for young people in NSW.

The Youth Opportunities Program provides one-off, time-limited grants between \$10,000 and \$50,000 to local councils for youth-led and youth-driven community projects that have a positive youth development focus.

Projects funded under the Youth Opportunities program are to involve young people at every stage of the project - from identifying the need, through to design, project delivery and final review and recognition. Organisations applying for funding must have spoken with young people and involved them in developing the project proposal prior to submitting an application.

As the applications must be completed and submitted online via SmartyGrants by 5:00pm on Monday, 8 August 2022, staff have developed a music program and are looking for the Youth Council to endorse and assist with the planning and hosting of this event.

We would like to propose a "Yass Valley Rising Star" event at Tallagandra Hill Winery. The event would include the following:

- Indoor main music program
 - 4 hour festival-style music program with 1 headline act x 60 minutes; 5 local support acts x 30 minutes; dance performance from Kulture Break (youth program); and focus on youth/supporting youth.
 - Suggested headline acts we could approach are Kate Ceberano and her band; Mahalia Barnes and the Soul Mates; Vance Joy; Boy and Bear; and Amy Shark
 - Suggested local supporting acts could be Lucy Sugerman; Koebi faumui, Liv Li; Marty K, or Muesli
- Outdoor picnic site (back of the truck) with small scale acoustic performances from up and coming local artists.
- Outdoor picnic site for kids: jumping castle, other activities.
- The estimated cost for such an event would be approx. \$50,000.
- Possible timing would be 21-22 January, 4-5 February or 18-19 February 2023.

Due to the closing date of the grant, Council staff have submitted an application. We recommend the Youth Council support this recommendation. If it does not wish to support this event, we can withdraw the application.

3.4 REGION-WIDE YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

SUMMARY

REPORT

Event update

The latest research shows young people are most likely to reach out to their peers with a problem. Therefore, the aim of Yass Valley's event will be to help young people check in on a friend, navigate a tricky conversation and know what to do if a friend needs help.

Following discussions with other councils and Yass High School Deputy Principal Andrew Facer, the following event is proposed to be held between 19-23 September at Yass High School:

- Sausage sizzle breakfast with agencies such as PCYC, Headspace, TAFE etc.
- 150 care packs handed out during breakfast
- Youth Mental Health First Aid training delivered to 10-15 students from years 8-10
- Workshop with participants on ideas to continue to develop a healthy culture around mental health at the school i.e. implementation of mental health ambassadors or a special mental health day best idea will receive a prize
- Youth Mental Health First Aid training delivered to 10-15 students from years 8-10 OR presentation to whole of school by qualified youth mental health worker

Council will work with Upper Lachlan Shire Council, Goulburn Mulwaree Council and Queanbeyan-Palerang Regional Council to coordinate the event at Yass, Crookwell, Goulburn and Queanbeyan High Schools.
