

4.2 YASS SOLDIERS MEMORIAL HALL - UPDATE ON MAINTENANCE WORK

SUMMARY

To present an update on the maintenance priorities of the Yass Soldier's Memorial Hall.

RECOMMENDATION

That the updated works maintenance report be received and noted by the Committee.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Funding has been allocated from the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Grant – Phase 4 to the value of \$510,000 to fund works.

POLICY & LEGISLATION

Local Government Act 1993.

REPORT

1. Water damage from rain events

Unfortunately, the Yass Soldiers Memorial Hall suffered water damage during the recent significant rain events, resulting in damage to the electrical services. As a result, the Hall was temporarily closed to the public.

Rectification work on the electrical system has been completed, and due to the significant clean-up efforts of Council's maintenance delivery team, the Hall is able to re-open for public use with reduced access to facilities.

Work is continuing to rectify this situation and bring the hall and all its facilities back online.

2. Update on Stage 1 Roof Re-Sheeting Work

Works on stage 1 roof re-sheeting has continued to be held up due to contractor difficulties in suppling skilled workers to complete the job.

Hydraulic engineering drawings are currently being prepared for the box gutters and down pipes, to better manage stormwater and large rain events, as experienced in the last several months.

Works will recommence once these drawings have been finalised in the next few weeks.
